

## Home in d' Rock

SATB chorus with soloist(s) and optional djembe accompaniment

### Performance Notes

**Feel:** The feeling should be quite loose, as suggested by the shuffle groove set up by the djembe (although the song may still be performed a capella). The song calls for more of a folk/R&B style of singing than a classical style.

### Pronunciation:

*I* and *my* should rhyme with "baa"  
*got* sounds more like "gah!"  
*home* should have a diphthong with the scoop (ha-own)  
*d* is touched lightly and softly with the tongue but should *not* sound as "duh";  
*rock* sounds more like "rahk"  
*sky* and *cry* sound like "baa" with a very slight diphthong for the "y."

**Tone:** with each chorus, vocal tone should be in the front of the face and somewhat nasal, with "attitude." The verse part for the choir should have a hushed and mysterious quality.

**Soloists:** There can be as few as one, or as many as three. Soloists should use a "belt" voice with soul and passion and should have a good feel for the style, with loose phrasing and liberal scooping. Feel free to vary the written part for the verses: the melody can be thought of as a template for improvisation. Also, soloists may improvise freely over the choruses. If two or three soloists are used, they can all improvise together at the coda.

**Djembe:** The drum should be muted for the first chorus and all verses. For subsequent choruses, use an open and accented tone for maximum contrast. The written rhythm is a guideline; the player should feel free to vary the part as well as add accents.
