

Performance Notes:

"I Want to Die Easy" is a traditional spiritual. The opening rubato solo has a traditional flavor, leading to a more contemporary, funky gospel rhythm. Pronunciation of the words should be in a southern, African-American style. "I" is pronounced closer to "ah," and should have a glottal accent. The word "easy" should sound more like "ee-zeh." "

Phrases should not be sung literally, but with a bluesy scooping on such words as the “e” of easy (in all parts), “when I” in SAT parts, and whenever else it feels stylistically appropriate.

In the louder sections, the tone should be forward and brassy, with “attitude,” and not a classical choral sound.

The notation of the solo parts is meant to be a guideline only, and soloists should be encouraged to make the part more improvisational and personal, both in the melody and the phrasing. Soloists may also add an improvisational part over the chorus as well.

Clapping on beats 2 and 4 may be added on the chorus at ms. 63 and again at ms. 95, with no clapping during the solo verses.

The djembe part as notated is intended as a guideline to the groove. The drummer should feel free to personalize the part while still keeping the basic groove. It works well to add a short “fill” leading into each chorus.
