"Om Mani Padme Hum" is a Buddhist Sanskrit mantra, or phrase. "Om" is a sacred syllable symbolizing the desire for purity. "Mani" means "jewel," and "Padme" means the "lotus flower," a symbol of purity and non-attachment. "Hum" means that which is indivisible, that which cannot be moved. There are many aspects to the meaning of this phrase, but to me the most universal is that when we chant or sing *Om Mani Padme Hum*, we focus on sending out into the world unconditional compassion for all beings.
